

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

INTRODUCTION AND PRINCIPLES

The school has a smart, user-friendly, practical and affordable uniform.

This policy applies to all pupils including those within the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

POLICY

Faraday School requires that pupils adhere to our dress code.

All pupils must wear certain pieces of branded uniform, ordered from **Uniform4Kids**. Other basic uniform pieces, such as trousers, shorts, skirts and dresses can be bought from any supplier, as long as they adhere to the colours and styles outlined below. All items must be clearly labelled.

For all pupils:

- Dark grey trousers or grey skirt/pinafore dress
- Red Faraday polo shirt
- Navy blue jumper or cardigan with Faraday logo
- During summer months, pupils may wear grey shorts or a checked red/white summer dress
- Socks/tights (navy, grey, black or white only)
- Navy blue jacket with Faraday logo.

In winter months, pupils may wear a plain winter coat in navy, brown, red or black over their uniform.

Footwear

• Shoes (plain brown, black or red)

Pupils must be able to put on and take off their own shoes. If necessary, this may mean pupils wearing shoes that fasten with Velcro or buckles. No laces in Reception or Year 1.

PE kit

- White t-shirt with the Faraday logo
- Coloured House t-shirt with the Faraday logo. (optional extra for PE and House events)
- Plain navy tracksuit bottoms or white shorts
- Navy blue hooded top with Faraday logo
- Plimsolls/trainers (plain white or black no multi coloured or flashing designs)

School Bags

Faraday school bag with logo (which is large enough for everything)

Additional items

We recommend the children purchase the Faraday scarf, as well as the winter and summer hats, however, these are not mandatory.

Jewellery and make up

Jewellery is not safe or acceptable in school. Watches may be worn from Year 3. Earrings should be plain gold or silver studs only. Jewellery must be removed for P.E. Taping may be used where removal is not possible in order to enable participation. Faraday will not take responsibility for any watches or earrings which children lose. Nail polish, make up or temporary tattoos are not acceptable.

REQUESTS FOR VARIATION IN THE SCHOOL UNIFORM

Although Faraday School has a Christian ethos, we do not select for entry on the basis of religious belief, and we welcome pupils of all faiths and none. However, parents should be aware that all pupils are required to wear a uniform. The Head Teacher Mr Lucas Motion will consider written requests from parents for variations in the uniform on religious grounds that are consistent with the school's ethos and the **Health and General Safety Policy**. The Head Teacher may take advice, and will normally arrange to meet with the parents to discuss the implications of such a request.
