In Maths, we have been learning about place value within 20 ("tens and ones"). We are fantastic mathematicians and can identify tens and ones in numbers 10-20.

We talked about what belonging means in PSHE and the groups we belong to. We feel very proud to belong at Faraday school! We discussed different groups we belong to, such as families, places, and religions. Where do you belong?

In Math we consolidated our learning on Addition & Subtraction of three digit numbers and immersed ourselves a little deeper into our Multiplication & Division facts, focusing on dividing by 3, 4, 8, writing the inverse multiplication sentence for each and even exploring the bus stop method and partitioning as a means to solving bigger equations.

In English, we made inferences about the past, about characters and used verbs and preposition to describe the city scene of Pompeii. The children were super proud to see their published newspaper reports from last on display in the classroom.

Lastly, one of our very own budding poets confidently stood in front of the whole school to recite a few of her poems which she had composed over the festive period. Well done Iliya! We are keep writing!

Year 5 had a positive, full first week back at school.

In English, the children are thrilled to read 'The Lizzie and Belle Mysteries.' They have made useful inferences, written a diary entry as Lizzie, and discussed how the emotions change during a certain event in each chapter.

In Maths, the children continued tackling word problems. They worked in pairs to identify key words in a question and are becoming more independent in their reasoning skills.

In Geography, we are exploring the physical features of Asia. The children used atlases to identify which countries are in Asia as well as the different landscapes, seas and oceans.

In R.E. we explored Judaism, including Jewish holidays and traditions such as Hannukah. The children wrote a diary entry explaining what happens during Shabbat.

In D.T. we evaluated at the different type of bridges in the world. Children could use subject specific vocabulary, such as: advantages, disadvantages, strength, support, durability and cost. In Computing, the children planned Chatterpix character animations.


