We're almost at the finish line, but we are soaking up as much as we can before the half-term descends on us!
In Math this week we have been focusing solely on dividing 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers using partitioning and bus-stop methods as a means to solve these equations. We have also been practicing our ability to identify and solve 2-step multiplication and division word problems.

In DT we recapped our knowledge of features of a castle and children were able to detail the purpose \& function of each feature. We looked at a selection of castles from around the UK and discussed why the strength and stability of castles are important. Using 2D \& 3D shapes the children then designed and labelled their ideal castles.

In History we discussed the three main periods of Ancient Egyptian civilisation and mapped out important events within these periods on a historical timeline. The children shared their creative research projects with the class and they did not disappoint!

Lastly, Year 3 came dressed to the nines, in celebration of culture day on Tuesday with many opting to represent their or their parents countries of origin. A few children took the step to create some lovely presentations of their chosen country which they shared in house meetings.
