The week began with Earth day, providing an excellent opportunity for us to reflect on the seriousness of climate change and the impact plastics have on our environment. We participated in a virtual reality workshop that inspired us to commit to reducing waste by reusing and recycling whenever possible, pledging to be the change our planet desperately needs.

In Maths, we have demonstrated our ability to work practically by using a range of apparatus to make accurate measurements. It was a little bit tricky at times, particularly where we had to apply our knowledge of the four operations but we persevered nonetheless. We're excited to begin learning about fractions next week.

This week, we have delved even deeper into the summer term curriculum, using our natural curiosity to ask questions and to also think outside of the box.

In English, we leapt into our new focus book 'Flotsam' where we analysed a collection of objects connected to the book and in groups answered how, what, why and when questions. We discussed if any of the clues were connected in anyway and made predictions about the storyline based on the evidence before us.

In celebration of world Earth Day the children had the opportunity to partake in an hour long VR workshop around this year's theme, Planet vs Plastics.

In Computing, the children learnt that they would be tasked with creating an interactive playground for school children. We were introduced to the software Tinkercad and had fun practicing using some of the main features such as, placing 3D objects unto the plane, lifting, rotating, stacking and duplicating them.

In in Science, we discussed what weather station's are used for and how meteorologist use them to gain understanding about the climate of a particular environment as well provide information for weather forecasts. The children are excited as we will be setting up our very own weather station to observe our local weather over the course of a week.

Lastly, we would like to congratulate one of Year 3's very own; **Drushaan Taylor** on winning his category for the 'Fourth Plinth school awards'. We are immensely proud of his achievement as a school and as a class.

YEAR 5

This week, we dedicated time to Earth Day activities, The children are very knowledgeable and have various ideas on how we can take care of the environment. They impressed the session leader with the depth of their answers, extending their viewpoints at every opportunity!

In English, Year 5 have fully immersed themselves in our book, 'Kaspar, the Prince of Cats.' They have completed various writing tasks, including writing a letter, writing a persuasive advert and writing a setting description.

In Maths, we finished our unit on Angles. The children are very attentive in maths and enjoy reasoning skills, it was good to see them working so hard as they were taking on new challenges throughout the week,

In History, we began a new unit on Baghdad and The Middle East. Our Year 5's are eager historians, giving various reasons on how great civilizations started in the world and how they came to an end.

In R.E., we explored the story of Ruth and Naomi in detail. This linked in well with out previous knowledge of Judaism, as well as how Bible Stories help Christians in their daily lives through positive messages.

Lastly, the children had a lot of practice in Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning. They are becoming used to the various question types and continue to apply themselves in these lessons.

YEAR 6

Throughout the week, Year 6 dedicated time to Earth Day initiatives, looking at the theme of "planet vs plastic," advocating for reduced plastic usage and recycling to safeguard marine life and the environment. As a culmination of their efforts, they collaborated to create an educational video addressing climate change.

In their reading sessions, students explored Shakespeare's timeless classic, "Romeo and Juliet," analysing soliloquies and translating them into modern English while exploring thematic elements. Writing tasks continued to challenge students as they composed formal letters in old English to the "duke," urging action against the suspected charlatan, "Mr. Amicus."

In maths, they calculated the area, perimeter and volume of compound shapes. Religious Education focussed on prayer and worship in Sikhism, with students later tasked with writing their own prayers and reflecting on their significance. In P.S.H.E. students actively engaged in community and charitable activities. They created products, conducted market research and received positive feedback from the school community, particularly for their delectable waffles and ice cream treats.


Reading in Unusual Places Competition
